Guidelines Governing Five-Year Junior College Students of Cross-disciplinary Program for Talents of Dual Foreign Languages to Study in the Two-Year College Program

Approved at the Academic Affairs Committee on December 17, 2013

Ratified by the President on January 2, 2014

- I. The Guidelines Governing Five-Year Junior College Elite Program Students to Study in the Two-Year College Program, Wenzao Ursuline University of Languages (hereinafter referred to the Guidelines) are established by Wenzao Ursuline University of Languages (hereinafter referred to as the University) to encourage graduates (including students who delay graduation) from the cross-disciplinary program for talents of dual foreign languages to continue their studies in the two-year college program.
- II. Students undertaking studies in the cross-disciplinary program for talents of dual foreign languages who meet the following requirements can continue to study in the two-year college program (cross-disciplinary program for talents of dual foreign languages) of the English Department: (a) the student has acquired all credits required for graduation; (b) the student has passed the language proficiency tests for both major and minor languages required for graduation; (c) the student has passed the screening test organized by the University.
- III. The screening test organized by the University for graduates (including students who delay graduation) from the cross-disciplinary program for talents of dual foreign languages to continue to study in the two-year college program includes the following: (a) written documents (60%) and oral test (40%). The detailed items and grading criteria shall be determined by the English Department. The results shall be approved by the President.
- IV. The timetable and relevant issues will be announced in the second semester (mid April) by the Office of Academic Affairs.
- V. The Guidelines become effective after they are approved by the Academic Affairs Committee and ratified by the President. Revisions must follow the same procedures.
